Exercise your rights, UUM students told

UNIVERSITI Utara Malaysia (UUM) students should exercise their rights in choosing representatives during the campus election today, said vice-chancellor Prof Datuk Dr Mohamed Mustafa Ishak.

"Students should not let the opportunity go to waste as the election provide them with the chance to elect someone who can

voice out issues involving the students to the university management.

"I hope that UUM will become the university with the highest number of students casting their votes in the campus election," he said in his speech at the handing out of 1Malaysia Students Discount cards by Deputy International

Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Mukhriz Mahathir at the campus in Sintok, Kedah, on Sunday.

At UUM, 21 candidates will be contesting in the campus election with 12 for general seats and nine for three faculty seats.

Twenty-two candidates returned unopposed for their respective faculty seats during nomination

day last week.

Meanwhile, UUM Students Representative Council Election Committee chairman Prof Madya Dr Mohd Amy Azhar Mohd Harif said some 19,000 students were expected to cast their votes.

He added that 95% of students cast their votes in last year's campus election.
