## Lecturer receives posthumous PhD in business administration

SINTOK: A lecturer received a posthumous PhD in Business Administration from the Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM).

Hasuzi Salleh, the widow of Adam Mat, who was a lecturer at Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Shah Alam, received the PhD (Doctor of Philosophy) during the first session of UUM's 29th Convocation ceremony here on Sunday.

At the ceremony, Adam who succumbed to dengue fever in 2011 at 41, was awarded a PhD from UUM Chancellor, Tan Sri Tunku Intan Safinaz Tuanku Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah.

Hasuzi, 41, said although she felt saddened when receiving the PhD, she was also proud of her husband and wanted the couple's three children to share in the glory of their father's achievement.

"Let my children continue the footsteps of their father's accomplishments," she said.

The children are Adli Dhiyana, 15, and Alesha

Batrisyia, 15; and Aleesa Az Zahra, 10.

The convocation saw 6,737 graduates receiving scrolls which included 1,512 Master's degrees, 67 Diploma in Education and 5,158 Bachelor's degree graduates.

On the other hand, PhD recipients included graduates in Doctor of Philosophy (208); Doctor in Management (three) and Doctor of Business Administration (34).

Meanwhile, recipient of UUM's Royal Education Award, Mohammad Muzammil Mohd Nazli, 23, said he did not expect to receive the award.

The law graduate is currently chambering at a law firm in Selangor.

"Insya Allah (God willing), I will pursue my education to a higher level after this. My success is a gift for all, including my family," said the son of an engineer. — Bernama
